Dear Sir.

Further to my letter of 29 November, 1974, sent to each Association setting out guidelines in connection with potential athletes for the 1976 Games in Montreal, we have now completed Year Three.

We now require from your Association, not later than 15 October, 1975, the following details:

- 1. List of athletes who have now reached international standard and have competed with success during the current year and can be considered as Olympic possibles. In the usual manner of form filling, please submit one sheet of your Association's headed paper for each athlete to be considered, e.g. name and address, date of birth, and international record only. The Events in which he/she intends to take part in his/her particular sport, must be specified.
- 2. Where International Federation Standards have been set for the Games in certain sports, only those athletes who have achieved these standards during 1975 should be nominated to the Council at this stage.
- 3. We require also details of training programme, particularly the final two/three months preparation, so that we can be sure that each athlete will be fully prepared for the mammoth task which lies ahead.

Bearing in mind that this Council's views have been communicated to each Association's representatives at our two Seminars and through the correspondence referred to above, it should be clearly understood at this stage that no "passengers" will be accepted for the Montreal Games.

I look forward to your co-operation and integrity when submitting these lists.
